FRIENDSHIP


The English word 'companion' comes from the Latin phrase 'com panis' which literally means 'with bread'.

Jesus went to the Garden of Gethsemane to pray. He was worried about what was going to happen to him and he asked God to help him


Sometimes our problems and fears feel_heavy like a stone. What are you worried about? What do you need help with?
