#### Kindness Jar


Why not create a kindness jar as a reminder to be kind to others?

Decorate a jar and then fill it with slips of paper with suggestions for random acts of kindness such as:

- Do something to make someone smile
- Pick up litter
- Thank someone with a gift

Encourage participants to come up with their own suggestions and add them to the jar. Put all suggestions in the jar and decide how often you will complete these acts of kindness. Take turns drawing an act of kindness from the jar and complete the suggestions as a group.

# Film - Pay It Forward (2000)

This film demonstrates how acts of kindness can change lives.

(Rating 12 – <u>BBFC Insight: Contains some moderate</u> violence, language, drugs and sexual references)

A high school teacher sets his class an assignment to think of an idea to change the world for the better, then put it into action. One student's plan to "pay forward" favours takes off and spreads across America.
