<u>Windermere Policy and Planning Committee</u> The Convener, the Revd Dr Robert Latham, presented this report. He introduced Mrs Ruth Clarke, the Hon. Assistant Director, and the Moderator welcomed her.

<u>Health and Healing Committee</u> The Convener, the Revd Alasdair Pratt, presented this report.

After some discussion on items in the report not covered by Resolutions, the Departmental Convener invited the Revd Dr Lesley Husselbee to propose:

## Partners in Learning

Assembly welcomed the introduction of the new Partners in Learning material and encourages District Councils to explore with local churches ways in which this can be used as a resource for worship and learning together and in peer groups.

This motion was supported by Miss Katherine Horner, who addressed Assembly by invitation.

Assembly approved this resolution.

<u>Private Member's Motion</u> The Revd H E Ward proposed the following motion, seconded by Mr W Black:

## New Service Book

Assembly regrets the unseemly haste with which the New Order of Service Book is going forward and proposes that drafts of all the various services should be sent to Provincial Synods and District Councils for discussion and reporting back to General Assembly 1989.

After considerable discussion, the General Secretary suggested that the following motion might meet with the approval of the proposer and seconder:

The Assembly instructs the Doctrine and Worship Committee to circulate drafts of the majority of the services proposed for the new Service Book more widely and to receive responses before finalising the publication.

The Revd H E Ward and Mr W Black approved this re-drafted proposition. The Convener of the Committee responded, and Assembly approved the redrafted Resolution.

#### SYNOD RESOLUTION

On behalf of the West Midlands Province, the Revd John Waller spoke to and moved:

## Youth Leadership Training Officers

The Assembly, recognises the value of the work of the Youth Leadership Training Officers, and acknowledging that their services are spread too thinly through the Church to be fully effective, therefore affirms the ideal of the appointment of one full time YLTO in each Province who may also be involved in other training work; and authorises Provinces to move forward to make full time appointments as Provincial financial resources, and the situation as it affects other Provinces, will permit.

The Revd James Neary seconded the motion and reserved the right to speak later. The Revd Tony Burnham proposed the following amendment which was seconded:

; and authorises General Assembly to move forward to make full time appointments as General Assembly's financial resources, and the situation as it affects all other Provinces, will permit.

The first part of the amendment was approved by General Assembly.

Some discussion followed on the second part of the amendment. When put to the vote, the second part was approved by Assembly.

The Revd Michael Davies proposed a further amendment:

to delete 'General Assembly' or 'Provincial' from the motion.

This amendment was lost.

It was suggested that 'General Assembly authorises' be replaced by 'resolves'.

The Revd Tony Coates responded. The Revd James Neary seconded. The substantive motion now reading:

The Assembly, recognises the value of the work of the Youth Leadership Training Officers, and acknowledging that their services are spread too thinly through the Church to be fully effective, therefore affirms the ideal of the appointment of one full time YLTO in each Province who may also be involved in other training work; and resolves to move forward to make full time appointments as General Assembly's financial resources, and the situation as it affects all other Provinces, will permit.

This resolution was approved by Assembly.

## MINISTRIES DEPARTMENT

The Convener of the Department, the Revd Anthony Burnham, proposed that the report be received for debate.

<u>Vocations Committee</u> The Convener, the Revd Michael Stolton, presented the report of this Committee. He asked for the following amendments to be made:

Admissions "to the Roll of Ministers"

p.16, 3(a) add: Colin Foreman

p.16, 5(c) delete: Revd Ronald Townsend (Uniting Church in Australia)

p.17. 9 add: Revd Ronald Townsend (Uniting Church in Australia)

#### PASTORAL MEASURE

The Convener moved:

The Assembly receives the guidelines A Pastoral Measure concerning the suspension and resignation of Ministers and their deletion from the Roll of Ministers, and adopts the procedures outlined forthwith.

The Moderator invited questions before calling the Revd David Gardner to propose the following amendment:

to add to the Resolution: "with the exception of paragraph 18.3 and paragraphs 20.1, 20.2 and 20.3 for further consideration and review."

Mr Dennis Jolley seconded and reserved the right to speak later.

After some further discussion, the Moderator proposed and the Assembly agreed to adjourn debate on the amendment and the Resolution, so that informal consideration could discover if some amendment to the statement would make it acceptable, in which case the amendment to the Resolution would be withdrawn.

Later the Revd Michael Stolton offered the following amendments to the statement, which were accepted by the Revd David Gardner and his seconder.

- 18.3 Leave as it is
- 20.1 ADD after 'a pastorate arises' 'without a prior call to another pastorate having been received'
  CHANGE 'A minister is' to 'ministers are'
- 20.2 DELETE 'When ministers wish to resign from a pastorate'
  SUBSTITUTE 'Thereafter'
  DELETE the sentence beginning 'The Provincial Moderator is consulted .....'
  AFTER THE WORDS 'Should there be difficulty about'
  DELETE 'such a movement'
  SUBSTITUTE 'a minister's future welfare'

Paras 20.1 and 20.2 would then read:-

- 20.1 If any thought of resignation from a pastorate arises, without a prior call to another pastorate having been received, ministers are well advised to consult with the Provincial Moderator prior to taking any formal action.
- 20.2 Thereafter they inform the Church Secretary and the Secretary of the District Council in writing. Should there be difficulty about a minister's future welfare, the Assembly Pastoral Reference Committee may be consulted and will then exercise discretion about how the Church should care for the minister during a break in service.

Mr Stolton proposed:

The Assembly receives the guidelines <u>A Pastoral Measure concerning the suspension and resignation of Ministers and their deletion from the Roll of Ministers</u>, and adopts the procedures outlined forthwith.

Assembly approved the Resolution.

Training Committee The Revd Tony Burnham spoke of the increase in offers to train for the ordained ministry, for which the church is very thankful, and consequent problems for the Ministerial Training Fund. Considerable debate followed. Mr Burnham responded. Further comments were made on other items in the Training Committee report. Mrs Elizabeth Jupp responded and she moved:

## Northern College

The Assembly welcomes the report of the first visitation to the Northern Federation for Training in Ministry and the Northern College, Manchester, encourages them as they respond to the various suggestions it contains, and asks for a report on progress in 1989.

After some discussion the motion was approved by Assembly.

Support Committee The Moderator invited comments on the report of the Support Committee. The Convener, the Revd Peter Brain, responded. He then spoke to and introduced the 'Report on Employment Practice in the URC'. The Revds Elizabeth Nash and John Waller, members of the Working Party, spoke in support of the report. After some discussion, the Convener responded and moved:

#### Employment Practice

The Assembly welcomes the report Employment Practice in the United Reformed Church and sends it to District Councils for comment by 30th June 1989, in order that firm proposals may be brought to the 1990 Assembly. Provinces, local churches and other bodies should submit any comments by the same date.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

The Convener, the Revd Tony Burnham continued the presentation of the report of this Department. He moved:

#### Preaching Fees

In the matter of Preaching Fees, the assembly agrees that:

- a) the amount paid should always cover the actual expenses incurred by the visitor, whether minister or lay person, in undertaking the leader-ship of worship;
- b) and may, at the discretion of the local church, also include a gift;
- c) with effect from 1 January 1989 during a vacancy or sickness both a) and b) will be reimbursed, with a maximum figure being set by the MoM committee from time to time, both for a single service and for a whole Sunday.

The Convener answered some questions. The Assembly approved a) and b) of the resolution. The following amendment listed as c) and d) was moved by Mr Philip Wade and seconded by Mr John Gilbey:

- c) The Plan for Partnership be amended by the Executive Committee on the advice of the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to enable each Synod to establish its own policy and practice so that by January 1st 1989 each Province or District Council may reduce a local pastorate's contribution during a vacancy or sickness for either or both a) or b).
- d) With effect from 1st January 1989 the central Maintenance and Ministry Fund ceases the refund to congregations of any pulpit supply fees or expenses.

After discussion, the amendment was put to the vote and was lost.

The Convener moved part c) of the Resolution, which was approved by Assembly.

The General Secretary proposed that:

Assembly resolves that the Resolution on Preaching Fees, passed in 1987 (Record, p.18) shall continue in effect until December 1988.

Assembly approved this proposal.

The Revd J Waller moved:

- a. Assembly amends the Plan for Partnership in Ministerial Remuneration by the inclusion of the following paragraph 10 with effect from the 31 December 1988:-
  - 10. Pulpit Supplies
    In the following circumstances, the cost of pulpit supplies may be recovered from the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund by local churches.

- 10.1 When a local church is in pastoral vacancy and the Provincial Maintenance of the Ministry Committee's administration of The Plan does not provide for the local church's contribution to the Fund to be reduced to recognise the vacancy, the local church may reclaim the actual cost of pulpit supplies up to such maximum as the central MoM Committee shall from time to time determine. In group pastorates and part-time pastorates, refunds shall be available only in respect of the services which would have been conducted by the relevant minister had the vacancy not existed.
- 10.2 When a minister is receiving sick pay in accordance with para 6.1.3, the local church may recover from the MoM Fund the cost of pulpit supplies on the same basis as para 10.1 above.
- 10.3 When the Moderator of the General Assembly in any year is in local pastoral charge, the local church may recover from the MoM Fund the cost of pulpit supplies on the same basis as para 10.1 above.
- 10.4 When the minister of a pastorate is absent on a sabbatical term which lasts for a period of more than four weeks, the local church may recover from the MoM Fund the cost of pulpit supplies on the same basis as para 10.1 above.
- b. Assembly notes the wish of the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee to review the method of reimbursement of pulpit supplies, and authorises the Executive Committee to amend the Plan for Partnership in this regard, if it is requested so to do by the Finance and Administration Department, with a report of the change to be made by the Finance and Administration Department to Assembly 1989.

This resolution was approved by Assembly.

<u>Central Funding and Advocacy Group</u> The Convener, the Revd W Wright, presented the report of this group and upon his proposal the report was received for debate. He then moved:

#### Central Funds

Assembly requests the central Finance and Administration Committee to consider the establishment of one central fund to replace the present MoM Fund and the Unified Appeal and to report their findings together with a recommendation within 3 years.

On behalf of the South Western Province the Revd Alan Bound moved the following amendment which was seconded by the Revd Will Minnis:

Assembly requests the central Finance and Administration Committee to consider the establishment of two funds

- a. a mission appeal to finance missionary enterprise at home and abroad
- b. a central fund to cover the remainder of the present Unified Appeal

expenditure and the Maintenance of the Ministry and to report their findings with a recommendation within 3 years.

Considerable discussion followed. The proposer responded, and when put to the vote the amendment was lost.

The Revd Michael Davies, having given notice earlier, proposed the following second amendment:

Delete 'one central fund' and insert 'one or more new central funds as seems appropriate'.

After some comment Mr Davies withdrew the amendment. When put to the vote, the substantive Resolution was approved by Assembly.

The Convener moved:

Assembly agrees to the Unified Appeal being renamed Mission and Service Fund as from January 1989.

The motion was lost.

The Convener, the Revd Bill Wright, spoke to and moved:

#### Direct Debit

Assembly supports the central Finance and Administration Committee's efforts to encourage all churches to contribute to the Unified Appeal (Mission and Service Fund) by monthly direct debit.

With the deletion of the words 'Mission and Service Fund', the Resolution was approved by Assembly.

He further moved:

#### Advocacy Secretary

Assembly approves the appointment of a full-time Advocacy Secretary for a period of 5 years and instructs the Budget Committee to make provision for such an appointment.

After considerable discussion, Mr Wright responded, and the Resolution was put to the vote. Tellers were called and the motion was approved by 203 for and 198 against.

The Convener, the Revd Bill Wright, moved:

#### Advocacy Group

Assembly instructs the Nominations Committee to appoint an Advocacy Group consisting of one representative from each Province, plus a Convener.

The resolution was approved by Assembly.

The Convener moved that the Central Funding and Advocacy Group, having completed its task, be discharged with thanks.

Assembly approved of this resolution. This concluded the business of this group.

## Nominations Committee

The Convener, the Revd Brian Nuttall, presented the report of this Committee and upon his proposal the report was received for debate.

The Convener responded to questions and moved the appointment of Tellers for the Assembly Moderator.

Assembly appoints the following to serve as Tellers for the election of Moderator of General Assembly 1989/90: Revd Peter I Poulter, Mr Colin A Raggett (Convener) and Dr Marion M Schofield.

The Convener moved:

The Assembly appoints Committee Officers, as set out in paragraph 2 of the report.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

He also moved:

The Assembly appoints Committees and Representatives of the Church for the year 1988-89, as set out in the Appendix to the report, with the deletion of the Central Funding and Advocacy Group.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

The Convener spoke to and moved Resolution 1 in the Supplementary Report, and the motion was approved by Assembly.

He then moved:

The Assembly records its thanks to the following Assembly and Committee Officers who have retired or are retiring from office this year:

Mr Fred Brooman, Honorary Treasurer and Convener of Finance and Administration Department.

Mrs Janny Macdonald, Assistant Clerk to the General Assembly
Mrs Mary Marsden, Convener of Personnel Committee
The Revd Michael Whitehorn, Convener of Welfare and Emergencies
Committee.

#### FORWARD POLICY GROUP

The Convener, Professor Robert Steel, presented the report of this Group and upon his proposal the report was received for debate. The Convener spoke to the two Resolutions appended to the report. Comments and questions then followed on items not covered by the Resolutions.

The Convener responded and moved:

#### Central Committees

The Assembly agrees that there should be a review of the number and size of Committees and invites the Executive Committee to take the appropriate action and report to the Assembly as soon as possible.

The Revd Bert Baker proposed the following amendment, seconded by Dr Niall Martin:

to delete 'Executive Committee to take the appropriate action' and replace by 'Forward Policy Group to prepare proposals' and insert '1989' after 'Assembly'.

The Convener responded. When put to the vote the amendment was lost.

After further discussion, the Revd Donald McIlhagga proposed that the question be not put. This proposal was lost.

When the substantive Resolution was put to the vote, Assembly approved the motion.

The Convener then moved:

## Popular Report of Assembly

The Assembly agrees that a popular report of its deliberations for the use of local churches should be produced for wide circulation, and invites the Business Committee, in consultation with the Editorial Board of REFORM, to consider how this may be done.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

#### EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd Cyril Franks, presented the report of this Committee and on his proposal the report was received for debate.

The Convener invited the Moderator to receive and welcome the new Honorary Treasurer, Mr Angus Grimmond, and paid tribute to the retiring Honorary Treasurer, Mr Fred Brooman, CB.

#### SYNOD RESOLUTIONS

The Moderator invited Mr Ian Sinclair to speak on behalf of the Southern Province and he introduced and moved:

#### Durrington

Assembly receives the Durrington Community Centre Church, a Local Ecumenical Project with a considerable URC contribution and with District Council oversight, as a local church of the URC.

This was seconded by Mr Peter Spicer, and Assembly approved unanimously that this church be a member of the URC.

The Convener also moved:

The Assembly receives the fellowships at Caebach, Mid-Wales St David's, Pentwyn, Cardiff Rokeby, Reading

as local churches of the URC.

This motion was approved unanimously by Assembly.

The Moderator received, in the name of Assembly, representatives of the newly received churches.

The Convener spoke to and moved:

#### Ruscombe

The Assembly does not agree to the secession of the local church at Ruscombe, West Midlands, and requests the congregation, District Council and Synod patiently to seek ways of developing fellowship and pastoral care.

Mr L E Gaston and Mr J W Alder, representatives of Ruscombe Church, addressed Assembly in support of their plea to be allowed to secede. After discussion, the Revd Alasdair Pratt asked for the question to be put. This was seconded and carried by Assembly.

The Convener responded to the debate. Tellers were called, and when put to the vote the Resolution was lost by 89 for and 372 against.

The General Secretary moved the following Resolution:

The Assembly agrees that the Ruscombe church be permitted to secede from the United Reformed Church, with consequences in accordance with Clause 21 of the URC Act 1981.

The motion was approved by Assembly, and the Moderator, after having led the Assembly in prayer, greeted the representatives of Ruscombe Church.

The Moderator informed Assembly that the following Resolutions had been accepted by St Andrew's, Bournemouth:

#### St Andrew's, Bournemouth

The Assembly agrees to leave the petition from St Andrew's, Bournemouth, on the table until the discussion at present taking place between the URC and the Church of Scotland regarding joint membership in a local church is completed and the views of the Church of Scotland are known.

If the Church of Scotland should agree to joint membership in a local church as a possibility, the Assembly will urge St Andrew's to give this further consideration.

On the proposal of the Convener the motions were approved by Assembly.

The Revd Cyril Franks moved:

## Lay Ministries

The Assembly approves the statement in Section 5 of the Report on Support for Lay Ministries.

The resolution was approved by Assembly. He further moved:

#### Revd Tony Burnham

The Assembly re-appoints the Reverend Anthony Gerald Burnham BA as Moderator of the North Western Provincial Synod from 1 September 1988 for a period of five years.

The resolution was approved by Assembly. The Moderator received and greeted the Revd A G Burnham.

The Convener also moved:

## Retired Ministers

The Assembly ratified the amendments to the Basis and Structure of the URC referred by the 1987 Assembly to District Council and Synods and notes the definition of Retired Minister provided by Executive Committee.

- 9.3.g A Minister Emeritus amend to read A retired minister ...
  9.3.h All Ministers Emeriti amend to read All retired ministers not covered by clause 9.3.g residing in the District...
  9.3.viii To be deleted
  9.3.ix to 9.3.xix to be re-numbered viii to xviii
  9.4.g A Minister Emeritus amend to read A retired minister ....
  9.4.h All Ministers Emeriti amend to read All retired ministers not covered by clause 9.4.g residing in the Province....
  9.4.xv To be deleted
- 9.4.xvi and xvii to be re-numbered xv and xvi.

The resolution was approved by Assembly. This concluded the business of the Executive Committee.

## PRIVATE MEMBER'S MOTION

#### Nuclear Disarmament

The Assembly welcomes the US/Soviet agreement to remove intermediate range nuclear weapons from Europe; notes with concern proposals to deploy new nuclear weapons to compensate for those removed under the Treaty; and calls upon HMG, and other European Governments, to reject such deployments and to work instead for further measures of nuclear disarmament.

The following resolution, including an amendment proposed by the Revd John Reardon, was proposed by Mrs Eileen Brown:

The Assembly welcomes the US/Soviet agreement to remove intermediate range nuclear weapons from Europe; notes with concern proposals to deploy new nuclear weapons to compensate for those removed under the Treaty; and

calls upon HMG and other European governments to reject such deployments, to work instead for further measures of nuclear disarmament and to play a full and constructive part in the forthcoming UN Special Session on Disarmament.

This was seconded by Miss Fiona Gow.

On the proposal of Mr J Gilbey the words 'and conventional' to be added to 'nuclear' in last sentence. This was approved by Assembly.

The Resolution was approved by Assembly.

## FINANCE AND ADMINISTRATION DEPARTMENT

The convener, Mr Angus Grimmond, presented the report of this Department and upon his proposal the report was received for debate.

Questions were asked on the work of the Retired Ministers Housing Committee, and the Convener, the Revd David Skidmore responded.

The Departmental Convener moved:

#### Accounts

Assembly adopts the Accounts for 1987.

The Resolution was approved by Assembly.

The Revd J Waller, Convener of the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee, spoke to and moved:

#### Maintenance of the Ministry

Assembly approves the Budget of the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund for 1989 noting that it allows for an increase of 6% in basic stipend from 1 July 1989.

After some questions, the Resolution was approved by Assembly.

Mr Waller referred to the actuarial review of the Pension Fund at the end of 1987 and moved:

### Pension Fund

Assembly approves the amendment of rule 17 of the rules of the United Reformed Church Ministers' Pension Fund by the deletion of all wording after "shall be" in line 20 and the substitution of "calculated and fixed at the time of retirement in the light of the financial experience of the fund during the time when contributions were made but shall not be less than those provided under a table certified by the actuary which may be revised from time to time".

The Resolution was approved by Assembly.

At the request of Mr Grimmond, the Moderator greeted and received the Revd George Hooper who served as Secretary of the Maintenance of the

Ministry Committee for 10 years, and the Revd Michael Whitehorn who has served as convener of the Welfare and Emergencies Committee.

## BUDGET COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd Alasdair Walker, presented the report of this Committee. He asked that an error in the report be amended as follows:

On page 125, para.3. The last three lines to read:

'finance of the Unified Appeal, agreed to provide £1,566,000, and after further examination of the estimates, the Budget Committee are able to present a budget showing total costs of £1,772,000.'

and on his proposal the report was received for debate.

Points were raised and answers given, and the Convener moved:

Assembly approves the Budget for 1989 which provides for an expenditure of £1,772,00.

This resolution was approved.
This concluded the business of the Budget Committee.

## COMMUNICATION AND SUPPLIES COMMITTEE

In the absence of the Convener, the Revd David Netherwood, Mr Norman Hart was invited to present this report, and upon his proposal the report was received for debate. Mr Hart responded to questions and comments.

#### CHURCH AND SOCIETY DEPARTMENT

The Convener, Dr Mary Ede, presented the report of this Department, and upon her proposal the report was received for debate. Considerable discussion ensued on items not covered by Resolutions. The Convener responded to questions and comments, and she spoke to and moved:

#### Welfare State

The Assembly encourages churches to study proposals for change in the main spheres of the Welfare State (social security, health, housing, social services and education) using the questions contained in the report; and to engage in public debate and appropriate action to safeguard and improve community services wherever they are threatened.

After some discussion, Mrs Claire Shephard proposed an addition to the Resolution, and this was seconded:-

to insert after 'report;': 'to seek out and help in instances of difficulty, and at the same time request government to make specific modification of the system to deal with these situations;....'
When put to the vote, the amendment was approved. When put to the vote, the amended motion was approved by Assembly.

The Revd Stephen Orchard spoke to and moved:

#### Religious Education

The Assembly urges Her Majesty's Government to re-affirm its commitment to religious education in schools by including it among the foundation subjects in the National Curriculum.

The Revd Richard Helmn proposed the following amendment, which was seconded by the Revd Peter Poulter.

After 'The Assembly' insert 'convinced that exploration of the spiritual and moral aspects of human experience is vitally important if the proposed National Curriculum is to express adequately the inherited values and the multi-cultural nature of contemporary society' urges Her Majesty's Government.....

The Department accepted the amendment and when put to the vote the amendment was approved by Assembly. The amended Resolution was then approved.

The Revd John Reardon presented slides to illustrate the statement of commitment adopted by the Christian Aid Board, and moved:

## Christian Aid

The Assembly welcomes the summary of the Statement of Commitment adopted by the Christian Aid Board and encourages churches to study the full Statement, To Strengthen the Poor.

## PRIVATE MEMBERS' MOTIONS

The Revd Brian Woodcock spoke to and moved:

#### National Policy on Social Services

#### The General Assembly

- (a) views with concern current trends and policies which threaten to reduce the quality of public services, to erode the principle of universality at the heart of the Welfare State and to widen the inequalities between the rich and the poor;
- (b) calls upon Her Majesty's Government to demonstrate that it accepts and is committed to the maintenance and adequate funding of health services, education, social services and shelter as a statutory obligation and national priority based on the principle of universality which is consistent with a caring, civilised society;
- (c) instructs the Church and Society Department to work ecumenically to ensure that these concerns are adequately and persistently brought to the attention of the relevant government departments.

This was seconded by the Revd Keith Forecast. After discussion, the motion was approved by Assembly.

The Revd Bert Baker moved:

Response to Aids

The General Assembly, desiring to help congregations concerned in making a Christian response based on a balanced medical, theological and pastoral understanding of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS), welcomes the publishing of the booklet, 'Understanding AIDS' which the Departmental Secretary, John Reardon, has jointly produced.

This was seconded by Mrs Mary Stacy. The motion was approved by Assembly.

## WORLD COUNCIL OF CHURCHES

The Clerk introduced the Revd Dr Avery Post. Dr Post was welcomed by the Moderator and he addressed Assembly on the subject of the ecumenical movement worldwide and the calling of the World Council of Churches as it reaches its 40th anniversary. At the conclusion of Dr Post's address, he greeted the Moderator and Clerk in the name of the United Church of Christ.

#### MODERATORS' REPORT

The Revd Nelson Bainbridge presented the report of the Moderators. The report was received with acclamation by Assembly, and discussion followed. The Revd Nelson Bainbridge responded to comments made.

## WORLD CHURCH & MISSION DEPARTMENT

The Convener, Mrs Rosalind Goodfellow, introduced the following to the Moderator, who greeted them on behalf of Assembly.

Returning missionaries: The Revd Donald Horsfield The Revd Jean Hall The Revd John Crocker

URC scholarship holders: The Revd Moses Bakar Miss Kim See Son

CWM scholarship holder: The Revd Rosiam Kuica

Upon the Convener's proposal, the report was received for debate.

Mrs Mary Marsden introduced the Revd Yvette Rabemila, who was welcomed by the Moderator and invited to address Assembly. Mrs Muriel Garrow and the Revd John Smith also assisted in the presentation.

The Convener expressed the thanks of the Department to Mrs Mary Marsden, Personnel Convener, who was to retire at the end of this Assembly. This appreciation was endorsed by acclamation.

Comment and questions then followed on items in the report not covered by Resolutions. The Convener responded.

## MEW ABROAD COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd Derek Wales, introduced the report of this Committee. Comments and questions followed on items not covered by Resolutions. The Convener moved:

## Israel

Assembly, recognising that both Jews and Palestinians have well founded claims to own territory and live autonomously within the same land, urges members of the United Reformed Church to inform themselves about the Palestinian situation, to pray for a reconciliation of the conflicting claims, and, when visiting Israel, to make contact with the Palestinian Christian community.

Mr John Gilbey proposed the following amendment, which was seconded.

Assembly 'urges the members of the United Reformed Church to inform themselves about the situation of the Palestinian people, to pray for reconciliation, and to seize any opportunities of making contact with the Palestinian and Christian community.'

The amendment was approved.

The Revd Ian Duncan further proposed, and it was seconded, that the word 'Christian' be deleted from the amendment. When put to the vote, it was lost.

The first amendment became the substantive motion.

After further consideration the Revd Derek Wales moved the following amended version of the Resolution:

Assembly, recognising that both Jews and Palestinians have a need for a secure homeland, urges members of the United Reformed Church to inform themselves about the situation of the Palestinian peoples, to pray for a just and lasting reconciliation, and when visiting Israel and the occupied territories to make contact with the Palestinian Christian community.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

The Convener then invited the Revd R Tomes to introduce the next Resolution. After some discussion he responded and moved:

Assembly commends the statement <u>A Theological Perspective on Inter-Faith Dialogue</u> to local congregations and councils of the church for discussion. Assembly requests the Mission and Other Faiths Committee to receive responses, to continue discussion with the Doctrine and Worship Committee, and to bring a further report to Assembly.

The Revd Dr Lesslie Newbigin moved the following amendment:

for 'commends' read 'transmits'

This was seconded by the Revd Alan Dunstone. The amendment was carried.

After considerable discussion, the amended motion was approved by Assembly.

## MEW AT HOME COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd John Slow, presented the report of the MEW at Home Committee and invited comments on that part of the report not covered by Resolutions; he responded to these. The Convener spoke to and moved:

## Not Strangers But Pilgrims

The Assembly acknowledges with thanksgiving the Report and Declaration of the Swanwick Conference, and assures the other churches of the URC's full commitment to continuing the pilgrimage together.

After comments, the motion was approved by Assembly.

He further moved:

As part of the same process the Assembly authorises the World Church and Mission Department to prepare, and Executive Committee to consider and decide, a response from the URC draft proposals for the new ecumenical instruments or councils.

After discussion and the response by Mr Slow, the motion was approved by Assembly.

He also moved:

The Assembly requests that the final form of the proposals be available in January 1989 so that this may become part of Reports to Assembly.

which was approved by Assembly.

## SCOTLAND - CONGREGATIONAL UNION

The Revd John Slow, Convener of the Joint Negotiating Group, presented the 'Proposals for Unification' of the Congregational Union of Scotland and the United Reformed Church. He invited Assembly to correct some errors in the printed booklet as follows:

- Page 9 para. 3c(i) Insert in line 4 after '....due notice has been given....' and before '...by...', the words 'to the members of that church provided that written notice of the passing of such resolution has been given..'
- Page 37 3(i) and (j) These two clauses (each of two lines) should follow each other and the intervening paragraphs should

follow after (j).

- Page 38 Similarly (j) should follow immediately after (i) and the intervening paragraph should follow after (j).

  In (i) Provincial should be changed to Synod.

  This amendment should be added to the list on page 53 as No.46a. In (j) Province should be changed to Synod Area.
- Page 40 Clause 4(xvi) 6 lines from top of page. For 9(3)(xix) read 9(3)(xviii).

  Clauses (h) and (i) should follow immediately and the intervening paragraph should follow after (i).
- Page 42 A clause has been omitted after the heading 'Constitutional Amendment'. It reads as follows:
  - 10(1) No exercise by the General Assembly of the function of constitutional amendment contained in 9(5)(xi) shall have effect unless the following procedure has been followed:

The Assembly accepted these corrections.

The Convener spoke to the several parts of the document and asked permission for the Revd Raymond Bade to address Assembly.

The Convener moved:

The Assembly agrees that the process of decision for the URC on the Proposals for Unification be according to Section 10/1 of the Structure of the URC.

The Revd Ron Williams raised several points of order, which were ruled out of order by the Moderator.

Assembly approved the motion when it was put to the vote.

The Convener then proposed:

The Assembly gives first approval to the Proposals for Unification with the Congregational Union of Scotland (document dated December 1987) corrected in accordance with the Assembly order papers for 10th and 12th May 1988 including the Amendments to the Basis and Structure of the URC listed in Part VIII of the document, and refers these Proposals to Synods and District Councils.

Many contributions were made to the debate. The Revd John Slow responded, assisted by Mr Norman Pooler on legal aspects. Tellers were called, and when put to the vote the motion was approved by Assembly, the votes being 474 for, 2 against, with 3 abstentions.

The Chaplain led Assembly in prayer.

The Convener further moved:

The Assembly, through this referral, invites the District Councils and Synods to discuss the Proposals and agrees that should any Council or Synod wish to pass a resolution "that these Proposals be not proceeded with", such resolution must reach the General Secretary by 31 December 1988 (Structure 10(1)e).

The motion was approved by Assembly.

And also:

The Assembly authorises the URC representatives on the Joint Negotiating Group to continue with this work.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

The Departmental Convener, Mrs Rosalind Goodfellow, suggested that the Moderator greet and invite the Revd John Smith, who is President Elect of the Congregational Union of Scotland, to address the Assembly. He expressed the appreciation of the Congregational Union for the debate and the result.

#### COVENANTED CHURCHES IN WALES

The Revd John Slow, Convener of the Missionary and Ecumenical Work at Home Committee, moved:

The Assembly, recalling that in 1972 it encouraged the churches in Wales to develop a covenant relationship as a way towards church unity in Wales, receives the text of the response to Ministry in a Uniting Church prepared by the Wales Synod and forwards this to the Commission of the Covenanted Churches with the endorsement of the General Assembly.

The Revd John Morgans spoke to the resolution on behalf of the Wales Synod. After discussion, the Revd Donald McIlhagga proposed an amendment, and it was seconded, to delete the last seven words of the resolution - 'with the endorsement of the General Assembly'. The Department resisted the amendment. The amendment was put to the vote and was lost. The motion was then approved by Assembly by a large majority.

#### ELECTION OF MODERATOR OF GENERAL ASSEMBLY 1989/90

The result of the ballot for Moderator of General Assembly was declared by Mr Colin Raggett on behalf of the Tellers. 494 ballot papers had been returned, and the Revd C Keith Forecast was declared elected. The Moderator received the Moderator-elect amid the acclaim of the Assembly, and the Revd Keith Forecast responded.

#### BUSINESS COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd Adrian Wells, presented the report of this

Committee and on his proposal the report was received for debate. He introduced and moved:

## 1989 Assembly at York

## Assembly agrees:

- (a) to hold a fully residential Assembly at York University from 1-4 July 1989;
- (b) that the costs be divided, with the Unified Appeal meeting the usual amount, including all travel, and the accommodation cost being met by a personal contribution per member of not more than £25, with the balance to be borne by Provinces/District Councils in ways to be determined by each Provincial Synod.

The Moderator proposed that the Resolution be taken in two parts. After discussion, the Convener responded and Assembly approved part (a) of the Resolution.

Some discussion followed on part (b) of the Resolution. An amendment was proposed by the Revd David Bradburn, which was seconded, that after 'all travel' all words be deleted until 'the balance', thus reading as follows:

that the costs be divided, with the Unified Appeal meeting the usual amount, including all travel, the balance to be borne by Provinces/District Councils in ways to be determined by each Provincial Synod.

The Committee resisted the amendment. Tellers were called. The amendment was carried by 219 votes for and 204 against. Further comments were made before putting the substantive resolution to the vote.

The motion was approved by Assembly.

The Clerk spoke on the consequences of these decisions by Assembly. The Moderator moved that the incoming Moderator will assume office on 7 May 1989. This was approved by Assembly, thus suspending for 1989 the Rules of Procedure III 3(i).

The Clerk proposed the following resolution:

The Assembly agrees that the Rule of Procedure (1/1) denoting May as the Annual Meeting of Assembly be suspended so that the July meeting in 1989 will be the Annual Meeting of Assembly, and that subsequent dating in the rules (1.4) also be amended for that year only.

which was approved.

## ASSEMBLY PASTORAL REFERENCE COMMITTEE

The Convener, the Revd Arthur Macarthur, presented the report of this Committee and upon his proposal the report was received for debate.

#### THANKS

The Revd Alan Dunstone expressed the thanks of the Assembly to all who had contributed to its smooth running, and to those who had enhanced its life. He included in his thanks the work and care of the Clerk, and Assembly responded by acclamation.

The Clerk declared that the Assembly, having completed the business properly brought before it, stands adjourned and will meet again at York on 1-4 July 1989 or at such other time and place may be duly appointed.

The Moderator's Chaplain led a final act of worship and Assembly was closed by all sharing the Grace.

On Wednesday evening the Assembly travelled to Liverpool to meet with many people from the local churches in the Roman Catholic Metropolitan Cathedral. The celebration on the eve of Ascension Day, through song, drama, dance and testimony, focussed on the theme of Christ the King. The Assembly was welcomed to the Cathedral by Archbishop Derek Worlock.

Throughout the Assembly the devotions ad bible studies were led by the Chaplain, the Revd Clifford Wilton.

## Treasurer's report on the Accounts for 1987

In presenting the Central Fund Accounts for the year ended 31 December 1987 I would draw your attention to the following:-

- 1. As the result of legacies and other donations, for which we are most grateful, and the profit on the sale of properties and investments, the Central Funds have increased by £465,000 this year and now stand at £8.4 million.
- 2. In 1987 expenditure exceeded contributions by £69,000 in the General Fund and by £22,000 in the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund. This repeats the 1986 experience and serves as a warning that rising salary costs for lay staff together with a welcome slowing down of the reduction in the numbers of stipendiary ministers is having an effect on the work of mission which a reducing membership can, or will, support. We may have to add the costs of improving the general level of stipends, the potential effect of the Community Charge and other fiscal changes. We cannot rely on legacies and other donations to cover the gap.

However, it is encouraging to report that the response to last year's Assembly comments has been such as to enable us to recommend that the ministerial stipend be increased by 5%, with effect from 1 July 1988.

It would be appropriate to acknowledge the considerable amount of voluntary work by many people which helps so directly in the containment of the cost of running the URC at all levels.

- 3. The collapse in the value of quoted investments in October 1987 effectively wiped out the abnormal gains made in the early part of the year. In fact the market value of our investment portfolio at 31 December 1987 was £148,000 more than at the start of the year, and well over cost value.
- 4. Windermere Development Fund. The report on page 53 shows that that the General Account continues to finance the shortfall between project cost to date and the donations received.

However, the Centre is now fully operational and the General Account support was reduced to £6,300 compared to £23,000 in 1986.

5. Retired Ministers' Housing. The requirement to provide houses continues to increase and house prices to escalate. The cost is far greater than the sums received from legacies and gifts and at present the shortfall is covered by borrowings from the General Account.

#### REPORT OF THE AUDITORS TO THE UNITED REFORMED CHURCH

We have audited the financial statements on pages 49 to 69 in accordance with approved auditing standards.

In our opinion these financial statements give a true and fair view of the state of the funds at 31st December 1987, and of the income and expenditure and the source and application of current assets for the year ended on that date.

We have also audited the financial statements of the United Reformed Church Retired Ministers Housing Society Limited and the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund in accordance with approved auditing standards. We have given an unqualified audit opinion in respect of both of these sets of financial statements.

#### 1. Basis of preparation.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of investments at market value in the Common Investment Fund on page 66, the Investment Pool on page 67, and the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund on page 72.

2. Contributions to Unified Appeal and Maintenance of the Ministry Fund.

Contributions are brought into account on a receipts basis, with the inclusion of receipts in the early part of 1988 relating to 1987. However, where a Province had remitted more than the agreed contribution to the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund by 31 December 1987, the excess is carried forward as an advance payment on account of the contribution for 1988.

Legacies are credited on a receipts basis to the fund designated by the donor or to the General Fund if no fund is designated.

#### 4. Depreciation

#### (i) Property

No provision for depreciation is made on freehold or leasehold buildings. The Treasurership Committee considers that the requirement of the Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 12 that freehold and leasehold buildings should be depreciated is not appropriate for the Church, because the Church's policy is to ensure that the buildings are maintained to such a standard that depreciation is negligible. Had depreciation been so calculated it would have amounted to £43,000 in 1987 (£159,000 cumulative since 1.1.79.). Properties shown in Note 4 (Page 55) at £2.56 million are insured for £6 million.

#### (ii) Cars, furniture and equipment

Depreciation is provided on cars, furniture and equipment so as to write off the relevant assets over their expected useful lives at the following rates per annum:-

#### 5. Investments

Investments held for the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund, the Common Investment Fund, and the Investment Pool, are stated at market value.

Investments held by other funds are stated at cost. Units held in the Common Investment Fund and the Investment Pool are stated in the accounts of the investing funds at the cost of the units to those funds. The cost is based on quarterly market valuations of the underlying listed investments at the time of purchase. No account is taken of the excess of unrealised gains over unrealised losses in specific investments, having regard to the long term purpose of the investment funds.

Income from investments has been included to the extent that it was received during the year.

#### 6. United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund

The full accounts of the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund, an extract from which is shown on page 72, deal with the resources at the disposal of the trustees and short-term liabilities. Long-term liabilities for pensions and other benefits, which are expected to arise in the future, are not reflected in the accounts. The long-term financial position of the fund is dealt with in the actuarial report.

#### 7. Stock

Stock consists of books and materials purchased for resale in the Communication and Supplies Section. The stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 8. Westminster College

With the exception of certain building improvements capitalised in 1983, 1986, and 1987 and a house bequeathed to the college in 1986 the buildings and contents of Westminster College are not included in the Central Funds balance sheet, since the College was originally a gift to the Church, the value of which cannot readily be ascertained. The College buildings are insured for £3 million.

#### ACTUARIAL REPORT

A valuation of the pension fund was carried out by the actuaries to the Church as at 31st December 1984. At that time the actuaries reported that there was an actuarial deficit of £2.6 million on the fund. On the assumption that payments of £426,000 per annum to 1995 are made from the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund (that committee is resolved to make these payments) and payments of £15,000 per annum to 1995 are made from the Retired Ministers Aid Fund, the actuaries have reported that this deficit will be cleared. A further valuation of the pension fund will be carried out by the actuaries as at 31st December 1987. Upon the advice of the Pensions sub-committee, proposals were approved by Assembly in 1986 to increase the funding from the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund, (to £500,000 pa until 2000) and to improve the benefits of certain classes of pensioner.

The contributing members of the fund are not contracted out of the State Pension Scheme.

Accounting policy 6 on page 50 forms an integral part of the accounts of this fund.

# ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 1988

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TREASURER'S REPORT ON THE ACCOUNTS FOR 1988.

In presenting the Central Fund Accounts for the year ended 31st December 1988, I would draw your attention to the following points;-

- The central funds have increased by £1.4 million over the year to £9.8 million. There are many reasons for this increase, but I would draw your attention to receipts from legacies (p28), excluding legacies for the Retired Ministers Housing Society, in excess of £190,000, Thames North Province support of the Ministerial Training Fund of £250,000, and over £630,000 profit on the sale of properties. The Church is indeed grateful for the gifts it receives.
- The General fund (p12) report shows that income exceeded expenditure by £9,000, despite a payment to the Inland Revenue for tax on expense benefits relating to prior years. The cost of staff for the central work of the Church is rising each year, at a level in excess of the retail price index. The efforts of so many voluntary helpers is a considerable factor in keeping the overall cost within our resources.
- The contributions from local churches and a higher level of donations and dividends enabled the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund (pl3) to meet its commitments to our ministers. With the unbudgeted increase in stipends of £300 from April 1st 1989 and the uncertainties ahead regarding the cost of the community charge it is heartening that we have reserves to allow us to react to new situations with sympathy and promptness.
- Retired Ministers Housing. There is still need to support this area since house prices continue to rise (sharply during 1988), and perhaps more assistance will be required. However, with legacies, allocations from the Memorial Hall Trust and general funds, all requirements were met in 1988. Although we have a substantial number of houses we are not yet in the position to meet all requirements from the sale of the existing available housing stock. The very generous gifts and legacies are most gladly acknowledged.
- Windermere. The grant from general funds of £3,000 helped to reduce the deficit for 1988 to £6,900. From January 1st 1989, the Faith and Life department budget will bear the cost of the Director's supplement, but the grant from general funds ceases. The deficit of £7,800 to date has been fully provided for in the General Fund Account, but remains as a challenge to the Windermere Committee. Meanwhile, the Capital Expenditure on the Centre has exceeded the sums raised by £14,000.

#### ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### 1. Scope of these accounts

These accounts comprise those funds administered in the central office of the United Reformed Church on behalf of United Reformed Church Trust or United Reformed Church Retired Ministers Housing Society Limited. They do not therefore include funds administered by Provincial and other officers.

2. Classification of accounts listed on page 7

The capital accounts are permanent endowment accounts. The General Fund is for "furthering the religious and other charitable work of the United Reformed Church". All other funds are more particularly restricted, as indicated by the respective fund titles.

- 3. These accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standards Committee Statement of Recommended Practice, No. 2, 'Accounting by Charities' and comply with this in all material respects. The source and application of current assets report, which is not required by this statement, is replaced with a schedule of movements in assets, shown as note 3 on page 8.
- 4. Basis of preparation.

The accounts, which should be read in conjunction with the report of the Finance and Administration Department to Assembly 1989, have been prepared under the historical cost convention, as modified by the inclusion of investments at market value in the Common Investment Fund on page 21, the Investment Pool on page 22, and the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund on page 25.

5. Contributions to Unified Appeal and Maintenance of the Ministry Fund.

Contributions are brought into account on a receipts basis, with the inclusion of receipts in the early part of 1989 relating to 1988. However, where a Province had remitted more than the agreed contribution to the Maintenance of the Ministry Fund by 31st December 1988, the excess is being carried forward as an advance payment on account of the contribution for 1989.

Legacies are credited on a receipts basis to the fund designated by the donor or to the General Fund if no fund is designated.

#### 7. Depreciation

#### (i) Property

No provision for depreciation is made on freehold or leasehold buildings. The Treasurership Committee considers that the requirement of the Statement of Standard Accounting Practice No 12 that freehold and leasehold buildings should be depreciated is not appropriate for the Church, because the Church's policy is to ensure that the buildings are maintained to such a standard that depreciation is negligible. Properties shown in Note 5 at £2.71 million are insured for £6.6 million.

#### (ii) Cars, furniture and equipment

Depreciation is provided on cars, furniture and equipment so as to write off the relevant assets over their expected useful lives at the following rates per annum:-

Cars	30% on cost
Major Equipment	
Printing Machinery	20% on cost
Computers	25% on cost
Other furniture and equipment	10% on cost

With effect from 1988 the depreciation on other furniture and equipment is changed from 15% on written down value. The effect of this change on the accounts is negligible, and is reflected in the accounts for the year ending 31st December 1988.

#### 8. Investments

Investments held for the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund, the Common Investment Fund, and the Investment Pool, are stated at market value.

Investments held by other funds are stated at cost. Units held in the Common Investment Fund and the Investment Pool are stated in the accounts of the investing funds at the cost of the units to those funds. The cost is based on quarterly market valuation of the underlying listed investments at the time of purchase. No account is taken of the excess of unrealised gains over unrealised losses in specific investments, having regard to the long term purpose of the investment funds.

Income from investments, including the associated tax credit, has been included to the extent that it was received during the year.

#### 9. United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund

The full accounts of the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund, an extract from which is shown on page 25, deal with the resources at the disposal of the trustees and short-term liabilities. Long-term liabilities for pensions and other benefits, which are expected to arise in the future, are not reflected in the accounts. The long-term financial position of the fund is dealt with in the actuarial report. A copy of the full accounts of the United Reformed Church Ministers Pension Fund may be obtained from the Central office of the Church.

#### 10. Stock

Stock consists of books and materials purchased for resale in the Communication and Supplies Section. The stock is stated at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### 11. Westminster College

With the exception of certain building improvements capitalised in 1983, 1986, 1987 and 1988, and a house bequeathed to the college in 1986 the buildings and contents of Westminster College are not included in the Central Funds balance sheet, since the College was originally a gift to the Church, the value of which cannot readily be ascertained. The College buildings are insured for £4.4 million.

A further valuation of the pension fund will be carried out by the actuaries as at 31st December 1990. Upon the advice of the Pensions sub-committee, proposals will be brought to Assembly 1989 to improve the benefits of certain classes of pensioner, and the Maintenance of the Ministry Committee is proposing to continue the payment £500,000 per annum until 31st December 2000, to allow for these improvements, in addition to clearing the unfunded past service liability.

The contributing members of the fund are not contracted out of the State Pension Scheme.
