
Week nine: Monday 30 October A prayer for strengthening relationships From Wessex Synod

Each day will include:


W What does the Bible teach us? A short passage will introduce the day.

K Knowledge As you progress through the day, reflect on meditation and the relationships you have encountered; are they assisting or hindering your relationship with God and God's people?

This material is suitable for daily devotions, small groups and within worship.





Monday 30 October

Enriching relationships

W 'Encourage each other and build each other up, just as you are already doing.'

1 Thessalonians 5:11

A Think about situations and people who have enriched your life.

- Look out of your window/your office/your home/your church.
- Can you see people talking?
- Is the sun shining outside or is it raining?
- Are the leaves a rich colour of red or brown or green?

Look at the world and your environment, or if possible go outside for a short stroll. But **really** look; beyond your sight, look with your heart. Use the tree template, and focus on the **first branch**, and add more leaves and acknowledge people who enrich your life.

A Consider people and situations that have caused you anguish and restlessness, during your days and nights; or are you a challenge to people?

- What does it feel like to be at odds with someone?
- Can you hear God speaking?
- What comes to mind? Is it how you feel, or are your thoughts with the other person and how they are feeling?

Working through challenging and difficult relations, takes patience and forgiveness, and even though we may need to challenge a person or situation, we are called to peacemakers. Use the tree template, and focus on the second branch, and add more leaves and bring before God people and situations.

Fragile relationships

W 'Jesus wept.'

John 11:35

A Feeling fragile, whether physically, emotionally or spiritually is a vulnerable place to be. We can't be bothered to speak, or explain for fear of crying or emotionally crumbling. Yet every day we meet people who carry their fragility behind a smile. Walking the road of discipleship means that we carry for a short while our fellow sojourners' fragility. It is a privilege, not a burden.

- How can we help them feel loved?
- Are we willing to share their burden and carry their load?
- Have you ever sat silently and wept with someone, because they have felt too exhausted to speak? Sometimes the gift we give another person is the gift of silence and presence.

Use the tree template, and focus on the **third branch**, and add more leaves and bring before God people who are feeling frail and vulnerable.

A To enable new relationship to flourish you need to invest in time. We live in a pressured environment, where demands are upon us daily, plus we live in a 'fast' world. However new relationships need to be nurtured.

- Do you invest time in friendships?
- When as the last time you met a new friend?
- What do you think the other person sees in you, that friendship could flourish between you?

Use the tree template, focus on the fourth branch, and add more leaves and acknowledge the new friendships that God places before you on your journey through discipleship and what we can learn from them.

Friday Transient Relationships

W After this Paul left Athens and went to Corinth. Paul went to see them, and, because he was of the same trade, he stayed with them, and they worked together—by trade they were tentmakers. Every Sabbath he would argue in the synagogue and would try to convince Jews and Greeks.

Acts 18:1-4

A As we walk the way of Jesus, we will have many different travellers as companions. Some linger longer than others, some may stay for a short while, yet they leave a mark, an imprint which will never leave us.

- Can you recall a person whom you travelled with for short time, yet they left a legacy with you?
- Can you recall a memory, a laugh or a conversation with them?
- How did you feel when you both parted?

Use the tree template, focus on the fifth branch, and add more leaves and acknowledge the people who have come and gone from your life, but their imprint has never left you.


Open the link above, listen to the music and bring before God the people that have journeyed with you, name them privately before God.
